Tim Roberts to speak at Friends' Annual Meeting



Tim Roberts teaches history at WIU. He and his wife Emily enjoy the Macomb region's rich public history, public art and

public service opportunities. His last book was *This Infernal War: The Civil War Letters of William and Jane Standard*, about a wartime husband and wife of Lewistown, Illinois.

Tim's talk will offer information on the history of the Underground Railroad including its known operation in McDonough County and Western Illinois. The presentation will explore some of the perhaps less well known aspects and agents of the UGRR, as well as some of its popular myths.

The evening starts at 5:00pm with a social hour prior to the business meeting scheduled to start at 5:45pm. The business meeting will include the election of representatives to fill the two-year terms on the FOMPL Board of Directors which expire in 2024, a report from the FOMPL Board President, and adoption of the 2024-2025 budget. Dinner will be served at 6pm and Roberts will speak at 7pm.

The Shared Community Action Group is inviting residents to celebrate cross-community collaborations through the 2024 One Book One Community Festival (OBOC). The books chosen revolve around the theme "water," its beauty, its power, and its critical role for life on earth.

To ensure that children of every age as well as teens and adults can participate, the OBOC will feature three books to highlight the festival theme: *This Raindrop Has a Billion Stories to Tell* by Linda Ragsdale, *A Long Walk to Water* by Linda Sue Park, and *What the Eyes Don't See: A Story*

The festival events have been planned to bring residents together to explore some of our shared interests and basic values by reading and discussing a book in common.

Summer Reading Program is Read, Renew, Repeat!

The Summer Reading Program is back this year with the theme Read, Renew, Repeat. Young readers can pick up a reading log at the Youth Services Desk starting June 1, and complete as many 500 minutes reading logs as they choose by July 31. After completing a 500 minute reading log, readers will receive a certificate of achievement, prize book, brag tag, reusable tote and more. All additional logs earn another brag tag and entry into the grand prize drawing.

Aside from encouraging reading, the library will keep out young patrons busy plenty of programming. Move and Groove on Tuesdays at 10:30 am for children ages 0-3 plus a caregiver features stories, songs and instruments! Story time on Wednesdays at 10:30 am is open to all ages and often features surprise readers. Messy Makers on Thursdays at 10:30 am is for all ages and features a craft along with stories and songs. Tweens and teens are welcome to attend our Fantastic Fridays program where projects are bigger and imaginations are stretched, and the Anime and Manga Club is a celebration of drawing, movies, reading and more.

It wouldn't be summer without some special programming. This year the Macomb Park District and Macomb Public Library will partner for Little Lunchers in Chandler Park where children get a fun story time and lunch provided by a local restaurant. On June 12, we welcome Wildlife Prairie Park for an animal show, and on July 17 we will welcome the David Quesal Puppet Troupe

for two shows. PBSKids will come again to entertain young readers on June 12. We will wrap up summer reading on July 31 with Absolute Science and their amazing foam cannon. It will be a summer to remember!
